Who is an Oblate?

An Oblate is someone who is in love with God.

He or she is an offering, a gift, a sacrifice of love to God and His people.

An Oblate is someone who is living his or her own vocation to the fullest, striving only to serve God and other in the unique way each of us can do.

He or she is someone who listens to God's voice in the silence, humbly obeys and follows God and His Way. Through Lectio Divina, we Oblates allow God's Word to be "a light for our path", saying our "yes" to Him Who alone has the power to change and mold us according to His Will.

An Oblate is someone who is ready to receive God's love with open hands and with open hands he or she is ready to share His love with a suffering world in need of God's healing and mercy.

An Oblate daily seeks to see the face of God, alive and present in the Most Holy Eucharist, in the Word, and hidden beyond the faces of all those around us.

An Oblate is someone who lives in the world, outside the walls of the monastery. He or she does not belong to the world, and yet is called to share the light and peace of Christ, and to "feed" a world starving for compassion and love.

With Saint Benedict and our whole Benedictine family at our side, we plant seeds of hope, spread the fragrance of God's Love and re-awaken in the world the desire for Him and the coming of His Kingdom. This is our call. This is our challenge.
